WHAT TO DO

We can't think of a better way to unwind post wedding than admiring the beautiful views of Greece's most romantic island. Head for the capital Fira on the west coast for designer stores and bars - but be warned, they can get very busy in peak season!

If you're after a more laidback atmosphere, take a picturesque stroll to Skaros Rock. Locals say this spot, situated on the ruins of a 15th-century fortress, has the most romantic sunset views on the island.

Whether you join an organisied trip or rent a boat of your own, one of the things you should definitely do during your stay is a cruise to see the famous volcano and hot springs - a truly unforgettable experience to share as newlyweds.

BOUTIQUE BLISS

Iconic Santorini – The cave-sheltered rooms and sun-drenched terraces of Iconic Santorini (in Imerovigli village, the highest point on the island) boast the best views out across Aegean Sea. The building has been literally carved from the volcanic caldera wall on the hillside and transformed into a boutique hotel with a stunning pool and an intimate spa.

Hotel Anassa – A new edition to the popular resort of Kamari and just some metres away from the beach. This four-star small and intimate hotel combines a traditional Greek atmosphere with a more modern, luxury twist. It boasts 17 trendy maisonettes all varying in shape, colour and size. Attracting a younger crowd, there's an inviting terrace and pool area where you can relax as the bar serves a great range of drinks and snacks.
